paragraph 1 (lines 1 – 7)	Mardi Gras is a carnival tradition from France <i>(Mardi Gras – a carnival tradition from France)</i>	– Mardi Gras = most important festival in New Orleans, a carnival, 12 days long – from France, first celebrated in NO in 1837 – named after last day of festival: "Fat Tuesday" (= the day before Ash Wednesday, 47 days before Easter)
paragraph 2 (lines 8 – 12)	There are parades, music and dancing <i>(Parades, music and dancing)</i>	– parades: at least one a day; largest on Fat Tuesday – Captain, King + Queen at the front – music bands, dancers, costumes
paragraph 3 (lines 13 – 23)	Well-decorated floats are part of every parade <i>(fantastic floats (and a lot of work))</i>	– floats = fantastic: lots of work designing and decorating the floats, people start preparing early – masked characters on floats throw coins etc. to parade-goers in costumes
paragraph 4 (lines 24 – 27)	People come to New Orleans from everywhere <i>(Visitors from everywhere)</i>	– lots of tourists from the US + other countries – visitors should book early because NO is very full at this time

- d) Erwartungshorizont (Summary): Mardi Gras is a 12-day festival in New Orleans that comes from a French carnival tradition. It is celebrated about seven weeks before Easter.
