


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Scotch pancakes1

For 6 pancakes you need:

30 g sugar

120 g flour

1 egg

150 ml milk

How to make them:

- 1. Put the flour and sugar into a bowl.2
- 2. Mix the egg and some milk in another bowl.
- 3. Mix³ the egg and milk mixture⁴ into the flour and sugar quickly.
- 4. Melt⁵ butter in a hot frying pan⁶ and put some of the mixture into the pan with a spoon.⁷
- 5. When there are lots of bubbles⁸ on the pancakes, turn them over.⁹

Tip: The first pancake is often not the best one. Use it to find the best temperature.

6. Eat the pancakes with butter, honey¹⁰ or jam.

Scotch porridge

For one bowl¹ of porridge you need:

1 cup rolled oats²

3 cups water

1/2 teaspoon³ salt

milk or cream

How to make it:

- 1. Put the water into a saucepan. Bring water to a boil. 5
- 2. Stir in orlled oats with a wooden spoon. Reduce to low heat.
- 3. Cook for ten minutes. Stir⁹ every three minutes.
- 4. Stir in salt.
- 5. Cook for another ten minutes. Stir every three minutes.
- 6. Put porridge into bowl. Put some milk or cream on top and eat with a spoon. 10
